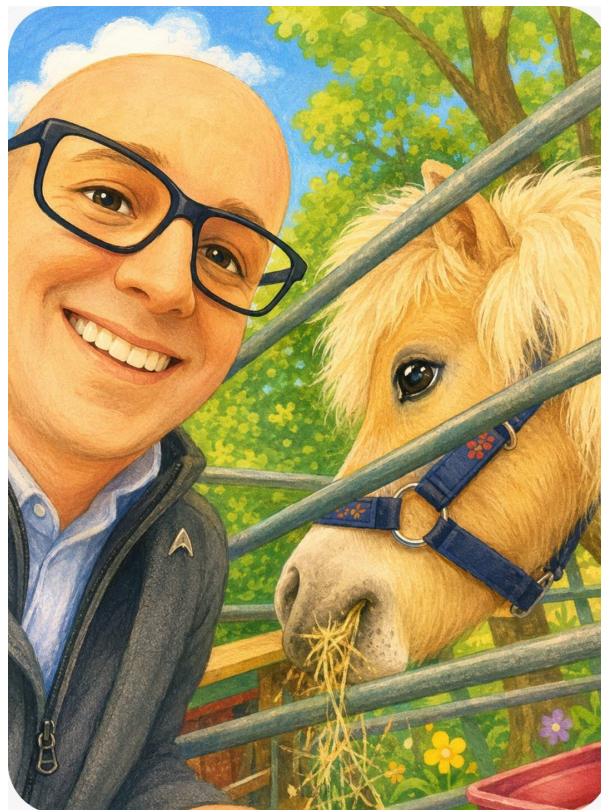

Explorer Class



Explorer Class have been loving our topic on transport. Last week, we were zooming into space with Mr Spoon on Button Moon and this week, ending our unit of work riding the rails on The Train Ride. The children have been making their own transport play, designing junk models and working collaboratively with the class construction kits.

In Maths, we have been extending our number knowledge by learning about teen numbers. We discovered that the '1' in numbers like 13 actually represents one ten with three extra ones! The children have been practising making, reading and ordering teen numbers using practical resources and number songs.

And the same as the whole school ... we loved the farm visit too! It was great fun meeting the animals and learning about how to care for them in actual real life on the school field.

Another exciting end to the term has been happening here in Discovery Class...

We were very lucky to welcome the travelling farm and enjoyed writing about our experiences during our English lessons. We have all enjoyed sharing our writing this term and I have been so proud of how hard the children have worked! In Maths, we have begun measuring length and height using both non-standard and standard units of measurement.

In Science, we have finished up our learning on the Seasons. We have investigated daylight and how the seasons in the UK effect animals and humans.

This term, we have also loved our DT topic, where we designed and made our own fruit salads. Today, we enjoyed eating them together in the lovely sunshine!

Voyager Class



What a fantastic term in Year 2! There are many highlights and the children have excelled themselves in their continued progress in the curriculum and have matured in their attitudes and social interactions. They are a great team. We've finished with some incredible writing linked to our focus text *The Proudest Blue* and we are becoming maths whizz kids being able to apply different strategies to different contexts - we've even been looking at fractions! In our topic lessons we have enjoyed exploring coasts and in Science we are experts in our knowledge and understanding of plants. How many of us have kept our bean plants alive? Our ultimate highlight would probably be having forest school this term. The growth in the children's focus, team work, resilience, curiosity and creativity has been exceptional and it has been wonderful to witness this. It was great to finish the term on a high with a camp fire and food cooking. Well done team Voyager, we look forward to the final term of the year where we start to become ready for the transition to Key Stage 2!

What a busy end to Term 5!

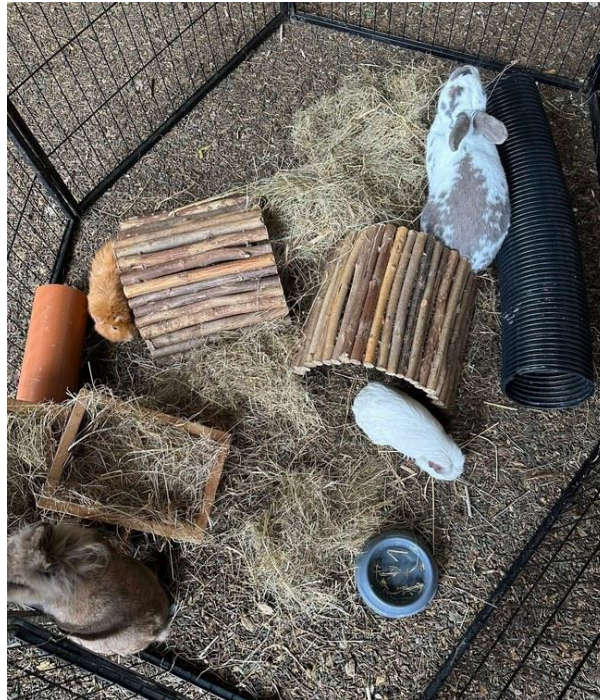
To finish off our learning about 'How Plants Grow' in Science, we learned all about the different parts of a seed and how each part helps a plant to grow. We explored how seeds store food, making them an important source of energy for plants and animals. We made bird seeds cakes, learning how seeds provide food for birds, especially when it is hard to find food in winter.

In Art, we painted our clay tortoises that we made as part of our Telling Stories Through Drawing and Making Art topic, based on the story 'Esio Trot'. They look absolutely fantastic!

In English, we created persuasive leaflets, encouraging people to visit the River Nile. The children worked really hard and their writing would definitely encourage anyone to visit! Odyssey Class have also worked really hard to master column addition and subtraction this term in Maths and we have been very proud of their determination and perseverance.

Well done for all your hard work this term Odyssey Class. Have a lovely half term break!

As part of their DT unit, the children have been busy making bread, experimenting with a wide range of fillings and flavourings including olives, seeds, mixed herbs, garlic, cheese and even cinnamon. We were also delighted to welcome Chloe's Farm into school, where the children had a fantastic time meeting a variety of animals, including sheep, a donkey, a Shetland pony, ducks, chickens, a rabbit and a guinea pig. It was a wonderful opportunity for pupils to learn more about animals up close.

In sport and music, our Year 5 pupils have continued to shine. The Year 5 girls' football team represented the school brilliantly at a 'Cup to Plate' tournament, demonstrating great teamwork, skill and outstanding sportsmanship throughout. Four of the girls also attended a football leadership event at Abbeyfield, where they developed their leadership skills and are excited to help start a new girls football club in Term 6. Meanwhile, the whole class enjoyed a fantastic brass session, where every child played the cornet together and demonstrated excellent focus and behaviour.

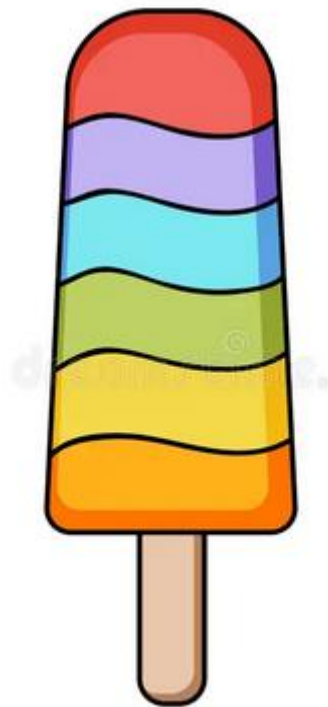
Treehouse Fundraising

FOSPA Summer Fete 11th July





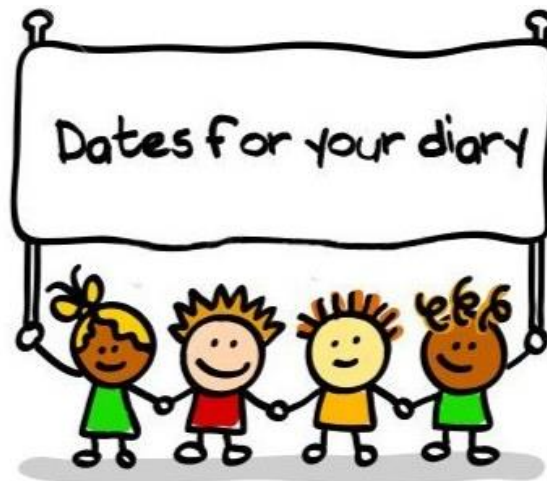
If you are having a clear out over the half term, please think about donating any unopened bottles (alcoholic or soft drinks), good quality books, toys and teddies for the Summer Fete.




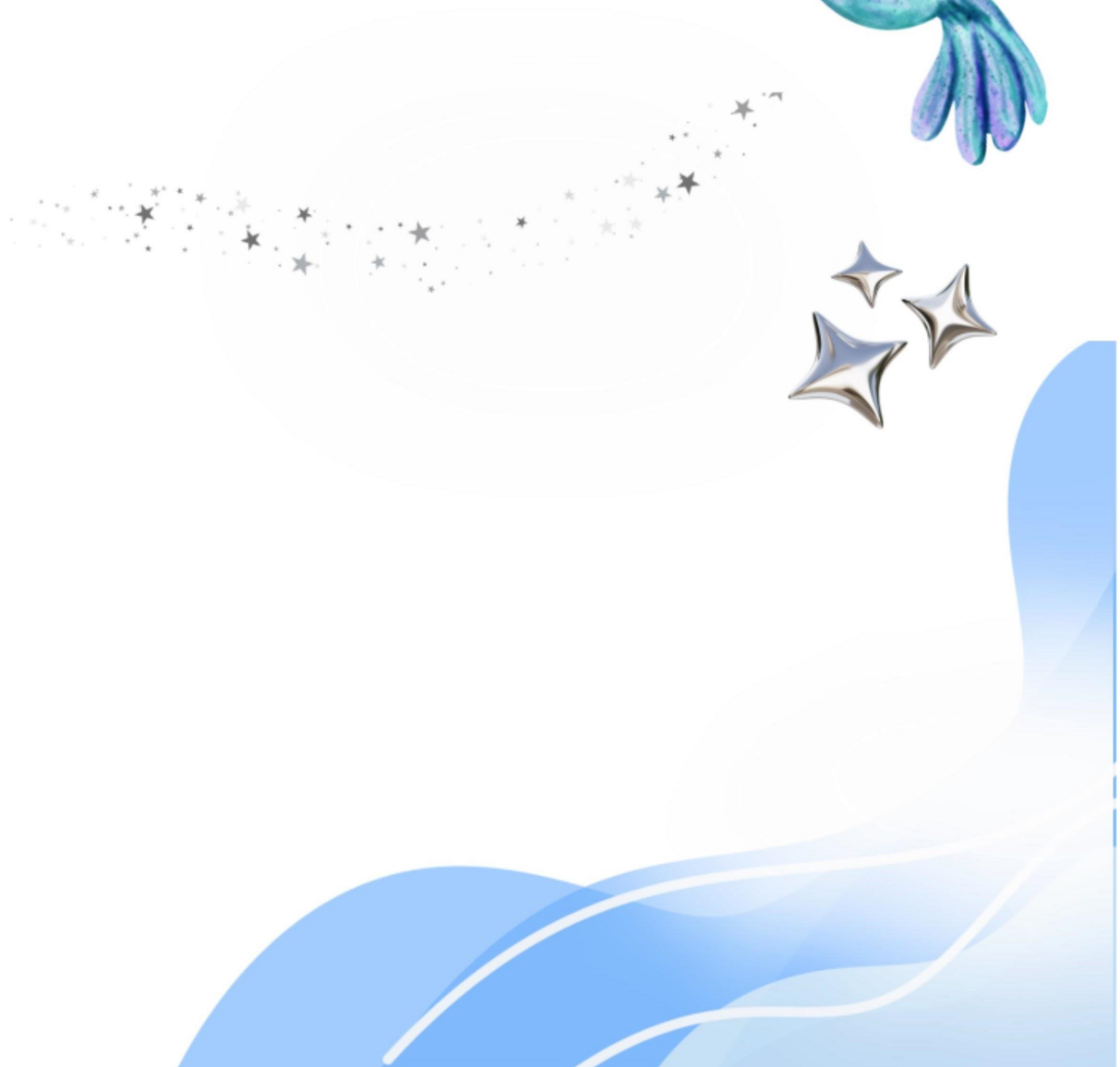
