We have been working hard in our phonics lessons where we are learning lots of alternative graphemes for phonemes, then we have been using these within our writing. The children are using 'the clues in the room' to support their spelling in writing lessons. We have been writing expanded noun phrases in response to reading the text Lila and the Secret of Rain. Next week we will be innovating this and creating our own story with a different secret!

In Maths we are working on 'quick maths' where we choose efficient strategies to count and understand number value quickly. The children are using manipulatives very well and are becoming quite confident in representing and understanding number value efficiently.

We've also been around the world in Geography, looking at different habitats in Science and understanding how animals or plants depend on their habitats to survive.

We continue to read every day and enjoy getting our heads stuck in a book!

Lighthouse Family Support Advisor



I am your Family Support Advisor, Jacqui Cook.

I have a variety of Family Support experience, working at all levels from child protection through to early interventions, with both children and parents/carers. I started off as a childminder when my children were small.

I then worked at a Children's Centre as a play worker running sessions like stay and play and moved on to a family support worker. I have also worked as a youth worker and worked in supported housing for young men. My last job before moving to Lighthouse was at Eldene Nursery and Primary School, where I was a Family Support Advisor and Deputy Safeguarding Lead. Some of my jobs were to support families with things from benefits and finances to attendance. I also attended meetings such as TAC/TAF, CIN and child protection meetings.

What is an FSA?

An FSA can offer support, guidance and a listening ear to parents. We can also work with other professionals such as health visitors, school nurse, school staff, social care team and many others to support your child and family's needs

How can an FSA support me?

These are some of the things we can support with.

- Behaviour at home
- Attachment and trauma
- Anxiety (child and adult)
- Routines, including morning, evening, bedtime, sleep
- Parenting Groups (therapeutic and programmes)
- Bereavement
- Domestic Abuse (both current and historic)
- Substance abuse

- Housing and benefit support
- Signposting for financial support
- Low mood and Mental Health
- Support with and/or contribution to Early Help Records/Education Health Care Plan
- Chair and/or attendance at Team around the Family/Child meetings
- Attendance alongside schools at other multi-agency meetings as appropriate.
- Completing onwards referrals to specialist agencies (for both parents/carers and children)
- Support parents to attend appointments and understand processes, sitting in at these meetings if requested
- Support for parents to complete paperwork, forms, applications, etc.
